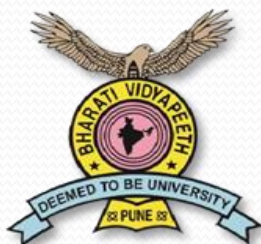

ABOUT PUNE

Pune is the eighth largest metropolis in India and the second largest in the state of Maharashtra. It is situated 560 metres (1,837 feet) above sea level on the Deccan plateau at the right bank of the Mutha river. Pune city is the administrative headquarter of Pune district and was once the centre of power of the Maratha Empire.



Pune is known to have existed as a town since 847 AD. It was the first capital of Chatrapati Shivaji Raje. In the 18th century, Pune became the political centre of Indian subcontinent, as the seat of Peshwas, the Maratha Empire's prime ministers.

Shaniwar Wada This fortress was built by Bajirao Peshwa in the 18th century to challenge the Mughal Empire and the British. It was a 13 storey building. It used to be the head quarter of the Peshwas and it represent Pune 's culture.

Sinhgad Fort is located around 30 km from Pune. It is one of the famous Picnic Spot of pune. This fort has seen many battle. The most famous being battle of sinhgad. It has 2 gates. One is called as Kalyan Darwaza in the South- East and Pune darwaza in the North-East. It is also a good trekking place. The PMT Buses runs every hour from shaniwar wada and swargate.



Dagadusheth Halwai Ganapati Temple : The temple was founded in 1893 by Dagadusheth Halwai, a sweetmart seller who became a wealthy businessman. Halwai had lost his son the previous year, and at the request of his guru created murtis (image of a deity) of Ganesha and Dattatreya. He later established the Halwai Ganapati Trust. Bal Gangadhar Tilak, during the British Raj, gave a public form to the Ganesh festival celebrations as a way of getting around an order that barred public meetings

Osho Ashram : Ashram of Bhagwan Rajneesh (Osho Ashram), in a 32 acre beautiful campus, is in Koregaon Park area of Pune. The ashram is a prime attraction for tourists who are followers of Bhagwan Rajneesh ideologies &



preaching. It is a resort for Meditation and Yoga.

One of the most significant landmarks of the Indian freedom movement, Pune's Aga Khan Palace is an elegant mansion built in 1892 by Sultan Aga Khan III. A must-visit for history-buffs, the palace's interiors display photographs, personal objects, and possessions of Mahatama Gandhi. It served as a prison for Mahatama Gandhi and Sarojini Naidu during the British rule in 1942-43, and also houses a mausoleum of Kasturba Gandhi (Mahatama Gandhi's wife).



One of the oldest and most famous *vada-pav* stalls in town, this one is a must-try if you haven't had it yet. In the bylanes of Narayan Peth, there is an iconic spot that serves a mouth-watering *misal*. If you don't like your *misal* too spicy, here you have an option to choose milder gravy.
